I may be showing my age as I ask these kinds of questions: “How did it get to be close to the end of 2021?” “Where does the time go?” “HOW MANY days until Christmas day?” I wonder how many others are asking these questions?

These questions seem mundane and a bit silly, though, in the light of Marcia McFee’s reflection:

“... we are reeling from prolonged uncertainty and instability brought on by the pandemic. In the United States alone, millions lost their jobs and are affected by whether or not landlords will evict them from their homes for failure to pay rent. A staggering number of families are food insecure for the first time in their lives. And those who were already on the brink are even less sure how to survive. **And we are all exhausted in some way** (*emphasis mine*). Even if it is decision-fatigue. We have problems to address.”

Yes, there are many problems to address. We are facing challenges of many kinds and each one’s *plate* is full to overflowing in a variety of ways. We have global concerns, national concerns, local concerns, and personal concerns.

Marcia reminds us that

“so did the Holy Family that [holy] night. An oppressive regime had demanded everyone upend their lives and hightail it to their hometowns to register for the census-for tax purposes, likely. Mary was on the verge of giving birth and the AirBnB app just wasn’t an option. Whether they got to town late or for some other reason, they had a housing problem that night.”

So, the invitation is for us to spend this Advent and Christmas seeing our situations in a different light. Seeing the church’s situation in a different light...

“the light of the Star of Bethlehem that shone that night on an unlikely house for the holy—a stable. It doesn’t matter what state your church [world, nation, town, home, family ... etc.] is in at the moment [and any uncertainty we might be feeling in those realities.] The Light of Christ is shining on *us*, inviting *us* to become a beacon of hope to others.”

We might ask ourselves: “What one thing could you do (or add to what you already do) that could alleviate someone’s suffering? And how could this [idea of “housing the holy”] inspire you to think bigger and beyond this holy-day season with purposeful solutions for your community housed in your church? We are called to “make room” in our inns—to create a welcoming space for the flourishing of humanity. That’s what the inn, the stable, the manger, became that night.”

Blessings and peace and we follow the star toward the joy of Christmas!

### Christmas Day Dinner Cancelled This Year

After 16 continuous years of providing a full Christmas dinner to those who would be alone or who are in need, the Christmas Day Dinner Committee has decided to take a hiatus this year due to continuing COVID concerns and medical/work issues among the committee members. We know that this meal has been a high point for many over the years and our hope is to eat around a table at the church again in the future.

### **St. John's Quilters, Knitters, Knotters, & More Continue to Be Busy**

You may have noticed the continuing thank you notes in our newsletter from individuals who have received one of the sewn items made by the Quilters, Knitters, Knotters, & More group here at St. John's. Throughout this past year, the group has been very busy, making quilts for adults, children, and infants; prayer shawls; knitted blankets for mothers and babies; and even baby booties and hats. There continues to be a need for these warm and comforting items, especially when individuals are ill or in crisis.

Since January 1, 2021, the group has distributed 194 quilts in a variety of colors, themes, and sizes. There have been quilts covered in the harbingers of spring, summer quilts that bring the flowering garden indoors, and quilts filled with pumpkins, colored leaves, and Indian corn for the Autumn months. The Christmas ones are now being made in a variety of designs and shades of green, red, and dark blue. Some of this material has been generously donated from a deceased member of Dreisbach UCC church.

The finished quilts have been given to church members who are sick, homebound or in nursing homes; individuals at local shelters such as Transitions and Gate House in Danville; four different local nursing homes; families at Century Village; children battling illness in Geisinger, and more. Our resumed Prayer Shawl Ministry has currently distributed 4 Prayer Shawls to shut-ins, with 15 additional going to a group of ladies at Selinsgrove Center as Christmas gifts. Finally, knitted items have been provided to Evangelical Hospital: 2 blankets for mothers, 8 blankets for babies, 1 hat, and 2 pairs of booties. And more are being made! And still more, need to be made!

Quilters, Knitters, Knotters, & More can always use more members. With the variety of sewn items, there is a place for you if you enjoy making any of them, or just like to sew. Even if you do not know how to make something, but are interested, we can show you how! Why not meet the group at our next monthly meeting on Monday, December 13, at 10AM in the Community Room at the church? There is always some work to do and plenty of good fellowship.


