Prophet on the Edge Health and Human Service Sunday



This is the logo of Health and Human Service Sunday, which many churches celebrate today.

The logo shows a circle of hands of many colors reaching for each other. This circle of hands reminds us that we are all involved in the circle of care sometimes giving, sometimes receiving, always included in some way in the circle.

In recent years we have begun to use the phrase "essential worker" to describe some workers whose work in the circle pandemic helped us realize we could not live without. As we honor essential workers on this day, we give thanks for all who are involved in the circle of care.

"The UCC and its predecessor denominations courageously founded schools, hospitals, and orphanages during times of pandemic, war, and social upheaval. Now, there are more than 400 UCC affiliated health care centers, hospitals, affordable housing and retirement communities, transitional housing for those experiencing homelessness or domestic violence, and service centers for children, youth, families, and those with developmental disabilities. These ministries continue to show up in the most challenging circumstances—and do so with the fervor of healing and justice."*
