"Aha" "Oh my" "Now I get it"

What do those phrases have in common? Someone is having an epiphany - a moment of awareness or a revelation (Wikipedia says it's "an illuminating discovery, realization, or disclosure"). In the life of faith the meaning takes on a slightly more specific meaning - and Oxford's says it "is the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12)." It's also "the festival commemorating the Epiphany on January 6."

As we move into the new year we are also moving into the season of Epiphany. The season of Epiphany will last until the end of February this year. During this season we will be exploring the many ways Christ's reality may be made manifest in our lives, in our congregation and in the world. How will we manifest God's love in the world? It may seem like a really big question with answers that seem overwhelming, but sometimes it's simply living life as faithfully as possible. Yes, there are times we see a need and respond; then there are other times when God surprises us and we had no idea that God is at work.

I love the surprising nature of God's work in this story:

"In their book *Spiritual Literacy: Reading the Sacred in Everyday Life*, Frederic and Mary Ann Brussat recount the experience of author Frederick Buechner who, in his autobiographical book, *Telling Secrets*, "breaks silence about a family secret: how his teenage daughter struggled with anorexia. There came a day when he, himself, was in the pits of despair, worried sick that his daughter would never get well again. But then, in a dark night, came a message of hope, from an unusual quarter."

Buechner writes: "I remember sitting parked by the roadside once, terribly depressed and afraid about my daughter's illness and what was going on in our family, when out of nowhere a car came along down the highway with a license plate that bore on it the one word out of all the words in the dictionary I needed most to see exactly then. The word was TRUST. What do you call a moment like that? Something to laugh off as the kind of joke life plays on us every once in a while? The word of God? I am willing to believe that maybe it was something of both, but for me it was an epiphany. The owner of the car turned out to be, as I suspected, a trust officer in a bank, and not long ago, having read an account I wrote of the incident somewhere, he found out where I lived and one afternoon brought me the license plate itself, which sits propped up on a bookshelf in my house to this day. It is rusty around the edges and a little battered, and it is also as holy a relic as I have ever seen."

May God surprise you with moments of revelation, moments of hope and moments of joy. May God use us in surprising ways to manifest Christ's love in the world (sometimes in ways that even surprise us)!
