From the mountains to the prairies, to the oceans, white with foam ... I was recently reminded of the incredible diversity of the terrain of the

United States of America. As I write this article I am sitting on a deck on a mountain with a gorgeous view of the rolling hills of South Central Kentucky. The terrain is unique and particular to the area. The winding roads and hilly area are exquisitely green and beautiful, with livestock and wild animals peppering the hills with life. The terrain and culture are unique and yet at the same time we could find ourselves in the middle of "every town" USA with interesting and fun residents. We learned that this area has one of the highest number of persons living in poverty, with almost 43% of children affected by that reality.

So, here we are, in this beautiful location, meeting people in many different kinds of circumstances and striving to be a part of the work of Henderson Settlement's important work. Having been here just over 24 hours, I am already appreciating the variety of ways ministry is being shared with the surrounding communities full of rich tradition among people with a great desire to raise those children with hope and purpose.

Henderson Settlement has an amazing philosophy of sharing the love of Christ with the world - and being the hands and feet of Christ in the community. The facility includes a Thrift Store, Monthly Food Distribution, a ministry to accompany Mothers from their pregnancy through their child's preschool years, an after school and summer program for children, a woman's group, a youth group, and a variety of other ministries of love in the area. Most recently, there is a house built for someone in the community with work groups coming in the summer months to complete the construction with the family. The work begins with listening to the needs of the community and working alongside the folks of the communities every stop of the way.

One day into the time here, we are learning about the Volunteers in Mission work of which we are a part. There are groups here from Pennsylvania, Florida and West Virginia this week. Each group is unique, with small groups and large groups working alongside one another. The day might be a bit long and exhausting, but definitely worthwhile and appreciated. We have 3 people representing St. John's this week and we look forward to sharing more details about the week and reflections around the experience. I am sure we will have interesting stories to tell.

While I look forward to sharing stories and details, for right now I hope this information will remind us to give thanks for the beauty and variety of our country and our world.

I also wonder if hearing about Henderson Settlement might encourage us as individuals and a congregation to continue to hear God's call to serve in our unique location with our communities' unique and real needs.

I am grateful for the opportunity to serve on your behalf in this exciting and rewarding way. Thank you for your support and your prayers.

#### NEW AUDIO/VIDEO SYSTEM - CONSIDER DONATING

During the past two years, our virtual church audience has been growing as people tuned in to Facebook or YouTube to view our worship services. Our service is now being viewed regularly by more than 100 people each week on-line.

During the past year, we have been investigating upgrades to our system in order to be able to deliver a higher-quality service for people to view from their homes. Our church Consistory made the decision at its most recent meeting to move ahead with the upgrades which will cost approximately \$80,000.

Consistory has set aside the funds to pay for this project, but we believe that many members will want to contribute to this effort, which will continue to expand our outreach.
