## THE EAGLE



"Are you weak and heavy laden? Is there trouble anywhere?"

Does this bring a hymn to mind?

Here's a better question, "Are you weak and heavy laden?"

It seems to me that many people I chat with are feeling particularly weary and burdened. I have some theories about why that is the case and I am not alone in that. We have heard folks talking about "Pandemic Fatigue" and I think the impact is real and long lasting. There's the continuing uncertainty and fear. Many will say we've come a long way, but we may also feel as if we must be constantly vigilant on the latest information and "numbers". Another dynamic I've noticed is the need to relearn day-to-day rhythms of life. So many of the things we did every day without even thinking now feel new and unfamiliar. Many have lost their rhythms and every day feels like a new challenge and a new "puzzle to be solved". I believe the day will come when we will feel some sense of life's return to normalcy (or, as they say "the new normal") and we will again find our strides in the daily activities of life, family, work, faith and church and community/ social activities, but I am guessing most of us are saying, "I'm not there, yet."

So, what's a weary one to do?

Here are a few ideas:

- Celebrate those moments that help us to feel refreshed. I recently sat outside at a high school football game enjoying the smells, smiles and noise of the event. I reveled in the familiarity and internally gave thanks to God for the simple gift of that moment.
- Be gentle with others since it seems weary souls are all around us, perhaps the cranky person you just met is weary and heavy laden, too. Perhaps this day has required more energy than they can muster (or maybe they are even "hangry"). How about praying a quick prayer either for that person or for yourself to have patience and kindness with them?
- Be gentle with yourself for God loves you right now and just as you are. The new book study describes this as God's "unshaken-off-able-ness". That's a mouthful, I know, but I love the reminder that "God's love can never be shaken off." That's true even when we are cranky or "hangry"!!
- From the old song ... "take it to the Lord in prayer". Dare to tell God about all of your reality. God already knows and God's desire is to walk with us through whatever our current reality might be.
- Practice gratitude. In a recent visit to a college campus I heard that the Spiritual Care department was providing gratitude journals for the students. The chaplain mentioned that there is evidence that a daily practice of gratitude impacts our minds and our well-being. (Google it and you can find some of these articles).

There are many other ways to address the current state of weariness that many are feeling. Find devotionals that uplift you and help you to start or continue your day. I recommend that if you haven't been reading Pastor Gary Nottis' devotionals on Facebook you take a look at those. There are printed devotionals available in the church's narthex. There are online devotionals galore. The UCC will send devotions to you every day. You can sign up at <u>https://www.ucc.org/daily-devotional/</u>. These are the devotions that Todd posts on our church's Facebook page every day.

Matthew 11:28-30 says, "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. [29] Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. [30] For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light. "Imagine the voice of Jesus saying this to you and to us ...

Dear ones, weary or not, God is with us. There is hope! God is up to many good things in our midst! You are loved right now - right here - just as you are!

#### "Red Book" Memories Continued I

"How Shall We Celebrate?"

In a little over 17 months, St. John's will celebrate 200 years of worshipping God, following the teachings and lived example of Jesus Christ, and serving the spiritual and physical needs of the people of Lewisburg and beyond. It is no small matter for a congregation to reach such a milestone. That is why "Red Book" Memories is returning to the St. John's monthly newsletter. Hopefully, this column will remind us of this faith community's extraordinary past and prepare us for the celebration of its bicentennial.

How did we celebrate previous milestones?

Our "Red Book" of history doesn't tell us exactly when our congregation came into existence in 1824. Neither do we know when or how our faith community observed it's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 1874. However, during the pastorate of Rev. Henry Harbaugh Rupp (1920-1937), St. John's did mark its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary with the publication of a brief history of the church and a five-day celebration of the congregation's founding. There were consecutive evenings of praise services and a Sunday morning worship from Wednesday, October 17<sup>th</sup> to Sunday, October 19<sup>th</sup>, 1924. Invitations were extended to all former living pastors to participate. Three were able to take part: Rev. Dr. John DeLong (1887-1889), Rev. Dr. Zwingli Yearick (1895-1899), and Rev. Dr. U. Henry Heilman (1869-1873). Unable to attend were Rev. Dr. R.L. Gerhart (1879-1885 and 1900-1920) and Rev. Dr. Irwin Hendricks (1890-1895).

During the pastorate of Rev. James Johnson (1970-1998), the congregation observed its 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 1974. A more elaborate celebration took place at that time. It extended over the course of nine months, beginning in March and concluding in November. Each month of that celebratory period focused on some aspect of the church's long history. It began with an address by Penn Central Conference Minister, Rev. Horace Sills. There was then a 50-year member recognition, historical presentations, an ice cream social, and sermons by previous pastors. Lay leaders were also honored, as were church members who went on to become Ordained Ministers, the spiritual sons and daughters of St. John's. What's more, our "Red Book" of church history was published after considerable research and effort by a team of dedicated congregants.

Our 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration required a good deal of planning, fundraising, and the generous giving of time, talents, and resources from church members to make it a reality. As we approach our 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we need to consider what we are willing to do to make this celebration special.

How shall we celebrate our bicentennial?

Currently, a small team composed of myself, Pastor Alice Rauch, and Beth Moser is spearheading the early work of planning our 200-year celebration in 2024. We are hoping to model the observance after what was done for our 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The team has created a tentative working schedule of monthly activities and has secured Penn Central Conference Minister Rev. Carrie Call to help us kick-off our bicentennial festivities in March, 2024. Just how much more we will be able to do depends on all of you.

The bicentennial team invites you to get excited about our upcoming 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary, just as our congregational ancestors did. Get involved. Help with the planning and any team formed for the celebration. We can use all the ideas and help the congregation has to offer. Let's make our bicentennial a truly memorable event, knowing that we are not only recognizing and taking pride in our past, but preparing ourselves for the next 200 years of worship, discipleship, and service.

#### NEW AUDIO/VIDEO SYSTEM - CONSIDER DONATING


