When the going gets tough, the tough ...

You know the saying. "The tough get going" is the traditional saying. I am wondering if we can change that a bit. What if we say, "When

the going gets tough the tough stop ... simply STOP"!

We are moving through the season of harvest and into the season when the natural world (at least in our area) slows down a bit and things go dormant. There's a good reason for the dormancy - for it's during the dormant times that living things slow down and prepare themselves to grow again in the next season.

Our UCC General Synod passed a Resolution Witness entitled "Becoming a Church of Contemplatives in Action". Contemplatives in Action ... many of us function the "in action" mode fairly regularly and often without being aware that we are doing so - putting one foot in front of the other and getting done what needs to get done. It's the "Contemplative" part that can be a bit more of a challenge. The resolution states that "the UCC has not historically emphasized to the greatest extent possible the fostering of spiritual, contemplative practices to love God and ourselves and to see God in all things, all people, and creation." In all fairness I believe we could say the same thing about our culture and about our daily lives. It often seems more natural and much easier to "do" instead of taking the time to simply "be" in the presence of God and taken the time to recognize and sense the love of God for all things (people and creation) including us!

As the season of harvest unfolds and we recognize the shorter days, cooler temperatures, and lessening plant life I encourage and invite us into a time of being

"Contemplatives" (the in action part hasn't been forgotten, but simple deemphasized). Being a contemplative can take many forms from sitting still and silent to walking and singing. I am including a wonderful graphic from Synod gives a visual reminder of the many ways to live out the life of contemplation. If you look at the tree graphic you will notice that some of the contemplative ideas include action. Interestingly enough even action can be contemplative if done with a desire to see God and love God.

When the going gets tough ... pray (alone or with a partner, quietly or out loud), meditate, visualize, experience the Bible's richness, take a walk, create something beautiful (knit, quilt, paint), make music, listen to music ... The time for action is now ... or it might be tomorrow, or the day after. But the time for drawing close to God is definitely now.

"Be still and know that I am God." Psalm 46:10

²⁸ "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." Matthew 11:28-30

When the going gets tough the tough trust God and know that God is with them every step of the way.



We were able to send a truckload for goods to the American Rescue Workers who sell the items to make money to help the hungry and homeless. Don Adams took 3 trailer loads of furniture, lamps and bedding to DIG so that low income folks can furnish a home. We sent about 40 pairs of shoes and boots to Soles for Souls in Mifflinburg who will get them to the homeless and countries where people have no shoes. We sent 32 big black bags and 4 boxes of clothing to Community Aid where they will be sold and the proceeds sent to places like the American Red Cross and United Way. We saved big box of winter jackets to give to any church having a coat drive this winter. AND for St John'swe made \$970!! It was all possible because of your help. Thanks to everyone.
