

We are getting geared up for the program year. Are you ready? There are so many wonderful things happening at St. John's UCC. Lewisburg. As pastor, it is a rich blessing to travel through this season with our congregation!

I ordered a recommended book looking towards planning a creative season of Advent. As I ordered the book, I read quickly and thought the title was "We Aren't Broken". I think that would be a really good title to talk about the life of the church. (Subtitle would be ... We aren't any more broken than the rest of the world ... it's part of the human condition. Then, I thought it would talk about how God will use us in spite of our brokenness). I guess that's a different book. ...

And it is an invitation to individuals and churches (and other institutions) to:

think creatively and practice wisely the kinds of institutional and collaborative efforts that "reimagine mission" and raise and deploy resources we need for the sake of innovation and transformation in our society and culture.

Even though this isn't the book I thought it might be, I am looking forward to digging into the book and exploring with our congregation the abundance that is ours in this new and different season of life and ministry together.

I invite each of us to prayerfully consider how we are calling to be a part of the new things that God is doing among us and through us. At the same time, we rejoice in and are grateful for the amazing stretch of tradition and ministry (almost 200 years) that brings us to where we are today. God is good.

Some of the exciting things that are happening are:

1) Messy Church. What's that?

What's Messy Church?

* It typically includes a welcome, a long creative time to explore the biblical theme through getting messy; a short celebration time involving story, prayer, song, games and similar activities; and a sit-down meal together at tables. All elements are for, and should include people of all ages, adults and children.

*It's fun.

*It's a church for people at all stages of their faith journey and of any age - a congregation that is as valuable and worthy of investment as any of your other congregations.

Knitting and Crocheting Mission Project



NEW SCHEDULE FOR CHANCEL & BELL CHOIRS YOUR HELP IS NEEDED IN BOTH


In an effort to make Chancel Choir and Bell Choir accessible to others, we plan to rehearse with each choir (Chancel & Bell) every other Sunday.
